SELECT AGENT SERVICES Call with AAVLD


On Friday, January 19th, AAVLD hosted a conference call with AAVLD members joining representatives of the Ag Select Agent Services program and the CDC Select Agent Services program to discuss issues relating to validation requirements for inactivation of select agent samples.

During the 2017 Annual Meeting, a discussion regarding a March 2017 requirement applying validation requirements to veterinary diagnostic labs generated a great deal of conversation and some concerns. AAVLD followed up with Ag and CDC agencies to provide clarification of the requirements.

The clarification of most interest to AAVLD members was whether the requirements applied to historical samples utilized for reference purposes. Ag and CDC representatives stated unequivocally that the requirements did not apply to any samples obtained prior to March of 2017.
